Championship Games

The Special Olympics Area 4 Games hosted at Stirrups 'n Strides was a spectacular day for riders and we were honored to hold it at our facility! Seventy-five (75) riders'

participated and over 300 family members and spectators attended. The weather was perfect! The Stirrups 'n Strides volunteer team and staff prepared for days leading up to the event. Volunteers came out in great force the day of the event and these efforts paid off with glowing results! I am continually and enormously proud of what our volunteers accomplish.



It's also gratifying to see what happens when our community pulls together. Marion County Commissioner Zalak joined us to open the games. The North Marion Jr. ROTC helped with directing the flow of traffic and parking cars & horse trailers. They also provided the Color

Guard for opening ceremonies. The University of Florida Equestrian Club provided 42 volunteers to help with preparations the day before and during the event! The Masonic Friendship Lodge #53 provided and served burgers and dogs off the grill. With these efforts, donations and our bake sale, over \$1,000 was raised to help cover expenses! A special

lunchtime appearance by the Royal Horses and Rene' & GiGi Gasser, awed the crowds. Volunteer judges Chris Cook, B-C Foundation Station, & Jim Olson did such a great job and classes ran smoothly. The 28 Stirrups 'n Strides riders that competed in Special Olympics Area Games worked for months to meet their goals and participate on this special day. Because of this great team effort, the Special Olympics Area Games was truly a memorable day!

The outcomes paved the way at the Special Olympics State Equestrian Games held at Grand Oaks, Weirsdale. Stirrups 'n Strides had 13 qualifying riders compete and take 7 Gold, 9 Silver and 2 Bronze medals! The smiles on everyone's faces made all the hard work and preparation well worth it! We are so proud of our riders!
